While no community wishes to deal with these issues, unfortunately they do occur. I am pleased to say that due to the dedication, professionalism and expertise of our staff all of these incidents were managed properly, investigated thoroughly and brought to the best conclusion that can be expected.

The ability to manage these events underscores the town's commitment to investing in the Police Department, allowing us to attract and retain quality staff and train and equip them to perform specialty functions that give us the skill sets necessary to investigate these serious matters. Our K-9 program, crash reconstructionist, crime scene technician, drug recognition evaluators, EMT's to name a few prove invaluable in giving the department the ability to provide high level police services to the community.

As Chief, it makes me proud of all department members. Thank you everyone for a job well done.

**Projects:** This month a Thomas College senior, Connor Pinkham, has begun an internship with the department. The internship will allow Connor to meet some credit hour requirements for his degree program. Two specific projects Connor is working on is getting updated contact information from our business community for our records and update dog licensing information on our Spillman software. Connor is helping give more interaction with the business community and gathering vital data our officers will need to contact business owner after hours, or locate the owner of stray dogs they may come into contact with. **Sand for seniors** is another project we have under taken with our regional TRIAD. This program allows for free sand to senior residents of our community that do not have the capacity to get sand on their own. I am pleased to say that Officer Tricia Buck has delivered over 12 buckets of sand to seniors in our community.
