The month of February has provided some opportunity to work on various projects we have been trying to complete. The transition of the former communications center is still coming along. The electrical work is now complete, the floor has been professionally cleaned and the painting is almost complete. Quotes from different furniture vendors have been obtained and will be presented to the town council for procurement authorization this month. Staff has also been working on reorganizing and identifying old files for destruction. As mentioned in an earlier report, our goals for completing these projects are to increase customer service to our citizen who come to the public safety building, improve the work flow and comfort for staff and utilize to the maximum our available space in the building.

**Training:** Training and staff development continues to be a top priority for the Police Department. Officer Eric Quatrano attended a three day narcotics investigations class put on by the Federal Drug Enforcement Administration. Officer Lee Maher attended Drug Recognition Expert training to begin the process of being certified to detect people impaired by various drugs. These trainings will help provide us with tools to investigate various drug violations as well as apprehend people operating motor vehicles under the influence of various drugs. Upcoming in March, Lieutenant Jim Boudreau will be attending an FBI LEEDA (executive development training) this is a weeklong training put on by nationally recognized instructors with student from all over the country from agencies of various sizes. Not only do these trainings provide quality instruction in areas that we need, it also markets the town and the department from at a state wide and regional level.

**Community Outreach:** We continue to reach out to seek opportunities to reach out to the public in this capacity. In addition to our work with TRIAD, Officer Matt Cyr is working on a project called Coffee with a COP. This is a program where members of the department work with a local business and set up a time where people can meet with us to share ideas, express opinions and concerns about the department and the community. Also, in April our read along program at the Primary School will start up again, now that various project and testing is done at the school.
